Report

Club Rules

Any member who misappropriates, damages or causes loss or breakage of the club's property shall forthwith make good any loss or breakages

- 2.1 No member's dog or dogs shall be off lead during official training sessions unless being trained and supervised by an instructor.
- 2.2 Any member not complying with a Request to place their dog back on lead, by a committee member or instructor, shall be disciplined at the committee's discretion.

Club joining fees and membership fees are non-refundable. 4.

All members are expected to volunteer assistance in line with the club's statement of purposes.

5.

- 5.1 Members' dogs are not permitted to chase or harass livestock or wildlife whilst visiting tracking areas.
- 5.2 Members should ensure that they remove all rubbish and keep tracking areas clean.
- 5.3 Members to ensure that they provide adequate shade and water for their dogs at all times.
- 5.4 Members shall take all reasonable steps to maintain cordial relationships with other legitimate users of tracking areas.

6.

- 6.1 The person authorized by the committee may order the removal from the training session, of any dog or handler whose conduct is objectionable.
- 6.2 The committee shall be empowered to discipline any handler who wilfully interferes with another member's training, or another member's dog, or whose behaviour is objectionable.
- 6.3 Any instances related to 6.1 and 6.2 should be reported to the committee in writing, within 7 days of the incident.

Treasurers Report

Hello Everybody and welcome to 2010.

It's hard to believe that the next tracking season is upon us. My name is Antonia and I am your new treasurer. I am pleased to report that the club is looking financially healthy, however, many of you have not renewed your membership for 2010. For those that have – thank you. Our club is only as good as its members.

We have loads of great merchandise and equipment for sale to enable you to track with your dog. Please see the website www.trackwest.com.au for details.

This year we are changing the way that we accept trial entries. Firstly, all entries are going to Judy (Trial co-ordinator) directly to avoid some of confusion and delays experienced last year. We are also going to be trialing a new system where you can directly deposit the

entry fees into the club's account. This can be done via the internet. You will still need to send (via mail or email) your ANKC entry form with a copy of the receipt of the transfer. If you are paying via the internet you will need to save a copy of the transfer receipt as PDF and attach it to the email to send to Judy. On your receipt please state your surname and dog's name so that we can match it to our bank statement. The close of entries will still be 2 weeks prior to the trial and all fees must be received on time. Alternatively, you can still pay via cheque or in cash if you are handing the entries directly to Judy - please DON'T send cash in the mail as the club will not be responsible if it goes missing.

This year we will also be issuing name badges to all members that are financial for the year. This will allow trainers to quickly identify everybody and also make it easier for all members to "remember" each others name. It will also

assist us in accounting for our members in case there is a bushfire and we need to evacuate. Name badges for members that have paid will be available on the first training day. Please ensure that you have paid your membership at least one week prior to the start of the season to have your badge printed it time. If you are not a financial member you will not be able to track. This applies to both new and renewing members

This year we are also introducing a differential entry fee rate, with non-members having to pay more for trial entries. Please refer to the Trial page for details.

Trial Secretary's Report

Greetings for a new year. Last year was a very successful one for trialling, with a qualifying rate of over 50%. Let us hope this year will be even better.

There are a few changes this year.

(1) We have been given permission by Dogs West to run our Tracking trials over two days. (Does not apply to Track & Search Dog Trials) This means that the majority of tracks will still be judged on Saturday but if the number of entries is large, the "overflow" will be judged the following Wednesday.

(2)

For competitors, this means that you will need to

- enter as previously, for the Saturday
- indicate clearly on your entry form if you are available to be judged on the following

Wednesday. This does not necessarily mean that you **WILL** be judged on Wednesday; it merely lets me know who I can transfer if I have to.

If you are to be judged on Wednesday, I will let you know by the Saturday before the trial. Please include your email address (if you have one) on your entry.

- (2) This year all entries come directly to me. Either give them to me at training (or to Carol if I am not at training) or post them to Trial Secretary, 27 Nyunda Drive, Wanneroo 6065
- (3) The entry fees have not changed for members but have gone up for non-members. See the schedules in this Newsletter.

One further point. Please be realistic when you enter. If your dog is working well and you aren't doing a bad job of reading him, by all means put in an entry but please don't enter

just because "he might just fluke it". Be guided by your trainer or ask one of the more senior trainers/judges to assess you.

Tracking Article

What is Tracking?

Welcome to the wonderful sport of tracking. "Tracking" is when a dog follows a scent trail left by a human. This sport is set up in such a way, that it enables handlers to attain titles, and ultimately have the joy of owning a Tracking Champion.

The equipment you need for tracking, is a well fitting harness and a 10-15 mtr lead for your dog. For yourself it is well worth buying a good pair of walking shoes/boots and waterproofs for the wet days. Later you will need a collection of articles (ie old socks, gloves, wallets etc) and flags for marking the track. Water is a must.

Any breed of dog can track, they all have a terrific sense of smell but some dogs are more natural trackers than others. Your perseverance as a trainer, using positive reinforcement makes the sport enjoyable for both of you. It's the same as any discipline, the more you put in the more you get out.

So where do you start? We want to encourage the dog to step track i.e. follow the exact line where the tracklayer has walked. Many dogs wind scent and therefore cut corners - this method is not acceptable to tracking for competition which is what we train for at TrackWest.

Remember, you are not teaching the dog anything new, just encouraging it to use its natural abilities and instincts. We don't use food on the track which would confuse the dog, but it can be used at the end of the track as a reward when the dog has found the "lost" person. A favourite toy is also a good reward at the end of the track.

Your first track will be you as the tracklayer (who else would be better then your dog's favourite person) Dogs often don't need any encouragement to find their owner, so we start off by letting them see where you go, to give them the idea of what is wanted of them, but we quickly proceed over the training sessions to not letting them see the route taken and they then have to use their nose on the ground to find the right direction.

Usually within 3 weeks the dogs are tracking people other than their handlers, having great fun playing hide and seek while you are busy learning how to read your dog. The way a dog indicates the change of direction or upcoming articles varies from dog to dog. Usually one of our trainers will point out to you, what in particular your dog does and this helps you know what to look out for, we have to learn to trust our dogs and being able to read them makes this a lot easier.

We progress from curves to proper angled corners, all the time setting the dog up for success by always knowing where the track is. By using flagged tracks so we can position ourselves to cast the dog around on corners, so he crosses over to the scent and finds the new direction. It will soon become second nature for him to cast around when he loses the scent, so when we finally come to work unflagged tracks, we know what signs to look out for.

You will teach him to ignore scents other than the one he has be given, find articles along the way, negotiate corners with confidence and find the all important tracklayer at the end. Some tracks will be fresh to give the dog motivation, others will be delayed so the dog has to put his nose down and work it out. We will vary the tracks so that each and every one is fun for the dog. Soon you will be on your way to earning your first tracking title and enjoying the journey it took to get there.





Spinach Cookies (Treats for the dog)

Makes about 40


- 125g Frozen spinach
- 2 tablespoons grated parmesan cheese
- 100g plain flour
- 100g fine rolled oats
- Water and flour as required



Cook the spinach in a little water, then drain it thoroughly and puree in a blender. Mix the spinach puree with the remaining ingredients to make an easily shaped dough. If necessary, add a little water or flour.


Preheat the oven to 180° C. Line a baking tray with baking paper.


Shape little portions of the dough with a spoon and place them on the baking tray. Bake for about 30 minutes.
